Rotary Youth Exchange has been providing high school students the opportunity to live and go to school abroad for over 75 years. More than 80 countries and 8,000 students a year participate in this great program. You may or may not know some of the rules that students agree to adhere to if they want to participate in Rotary Youth Exchange, such as:

- No driving of motor vehicles
- No illegal use of drugs or alcohol
- Must obtain special permission to travel out of the local area while on the exchange
- No romantic involvement or sexual activity while on the exchange



In addition, Rotary obligations take precedence over other extracurricular activities. These obligations usually include attendance at Rotary functions such as club/district meetings.

In order for the Rotary year to be successful, hosting club members need to participate in some way with the inbound student. This may be nothing more than a phone call asking how the year is going! It may be inviting the student to lunch, involving the student in a family activity, or going out for coffee or a movie; no big commitments are required. (Unless of course one chooses to be a host family!)

I am pleased to announce that our club has once again decided to host an inbound student for the 2008-2009 year. Thanks to those of you who made your voice heard, and for agreeing to take some time out of your busy schedule to help make next year's student's transition to another country just a little easier.
